


What will we need to go through as we grow up?

Solid Wood Chair - Red Oak Tree








Longevity Turtle and Cake Molds - Peach (Religious Life of the Taiwanese)

Legend says that the Queen Mother of the West grew magical peaches in the heavenly palace—eating them grants immortality. That's why peaches are often given as birthday gifts, symbolizing wishes for elders to have long and healthy lives.

Mosaic with Urn and Doves - Grapes (Christianity)

Jesus once said that his relationship with his followers is like that between grapes and their branches—inseparable. When growing grapes, unhealthy branches must be pruned to produce sweet fruit. Similarly, people must shed bad habits in order to grow.

Hanukkah Lamp - Almond Tree (Judaism)

The almond tree on the eastern Mediterranean coast is one of the first plants to bloom in spring, sensing the season's arrival before others. Through nature, Jehovah reminds people to remain vigilant and hopeful—even in difficult times, never losing faith in the future.
